HORSE OF THE CENTURY - TULYAR

At Newmarket, home of British horse-racing, lives a horse that has made turf history, and Marcus Marsh, his trainer, comes to greet him. Yes, it's Tulyar, the wonder horse, unbeaten in seven races this year, including the Derby and the St. Leger. And if you want to know where his great stamina and speed come from, just take a look at his magnificent build.

Meet Tulyar's younger brother who's still un-named. With a father like Teheran, a St. Leger winner in his day, and with Tulyar as a brother, he looks a good bet for the 1954 Derby (perhaps with Charlie Smirke in the saddle).

Smirke's hands, now making much of Tulyar, guided him to victory in six of the seven races the horse won this year. In this season alone, Tulyar won for the Aga Khan, his owner, over 275,000, nearly double the previous record. Justly has he been called the "horse of the century."
