VOLCANO DISCOVERED

A new, active volcano has been discovered on San Benedicto Island, eight-hundred miles south of San Diego, California. Its huge one-thousand-foot ash cone belches smoke and gas every twenty minutes. The island is uninhabited, so the young volcano (which has raised its summit one-thousand feet in only six weeks) can do no damage. San Benedicto may offer an important clue to the constant changing of the Pacific sea bed.

Together with other new information about the oceans floor, the new volcano on San Benedicto may offer an important clue to the constant changing of the earth's surface.
