LABOUR CONFERS!

To the Winter Gardens at Morecambe, Lancashire, where the Labour Party is holding its annual conference, delegates arrive by special buses. Trade Union Chiefs Arthur Deakin and Sir William Lawther, the miners' leader, have come to the aid of their party. Here's the boss himself, Mr. Attlee who, later, was to see his party-rival, Aneurin Bevan, triumph over him. Another Bevanite, Ian Mikardo, comes next. Now Harold Wilson who was voted to take the place of Herbert Morrison, (here seen with Hugh Dalton). He also lost his seat on the National Executive.

The weather isn't too good at Morecambe, but it's nothing to compare with the storms that Mr. Bevan raises in the Conference. His fiery speech upsets many of his fellow-Socialists, who see in his attacks on the policies of the Labour Party, a threat to the security of Mr. Attlee and his followers. Then a vote to select the National Executive is taken. As a result, Mr. Bevan and many of his supporters are elected.
