H. R. H. will be received by the Lord Lieutenant's appointed Deputy, Colonel T. R. P. Warren, C.B.E. D.L., who will present the Mayor of Slough (Councillor W. H. Jennings), The Mayor of High Wycombe (Councillor G.F. Ward), the Chairman of Eton Urban District Council (Mr. J. T. Ireland) and Mrs. Ireland and the Clerk to the Urban District Council Mr. G.H. Lewis.

Colonel Warren will present Lord Courtown (Chairman of the Buckinghamshire Playing Fields Association) who will in turn present Colonel F. A. Charlier (Honorary Secretary) Mr. Arthurton and Mr. Davies (members of the Executive Committee of the Buckinghamshire Playing Fields Association).

H.R.H. and party will walk through the Playing Field, and as they do so the teachers will marshal groups of children to the swings, etc., where they will commence to play on the equipment. The cars will have moved round the Playing Field and will be waiting for H.R.H. and party at the exit gate. As H.R.H. leaves the Playing Field, the Chairman will express a vote of thanks for H.R.H.'s visit.

H.R.H. and party will then enter their cars and proceed via Beaconsfield, High Wycombe and Princes Risborough, to Haddenham (31 miles) arriving at 11.30 a.m. at the Haddenham Playing Field. (On arriving at Slough Town Hall the royal car will halt, H.P.H. will slight. The Deputy Lieutenant will present the Mayor who will great H.R.H. on behalf of the town, and H.P.H. will then re-enter his car and proceed).

HADDENHAM at 11.30 a.m.

The cars will pass through the main street of the village and will halt at the gates of the Playing Field. As soon as H.R.H. has left his car, the R.A.F. Band from Halton Camp will play "The Queen". H.R.H. will then be inwited to mount a platform inside the gates. The public (children in front) will be assembled inside the Ground, behind a barrier. Two Standard Bearers of the British Legion will be in attendance. The Chairman of the Parish Council will give an address of welcome to H.R.H. H.R.H. will reply. He will then step down from the platform and cut a tape and officially open the Children's Corner. H.R.H. will then welk around the Children's Equipment and generally inspect the Sports Ground, returning to the entrance gates, where he will be given a vote of thanks by the Chairman of the Parish Council. H.R.H. and party will then enter the waiting cars and proceed to Cuddington, via Kings Cross (14 miles).

CUDDINGTON at 12.5 p.m.

H.R.H. will arrive at the main gates of the Playing Field through the new Housing Estate at 12.5 p.m. Lord Country will present the Chairman Country of the Parish Council, and Admiral Hamilton.

H.R.H. will enter the ground in which the public and children are already assembled. H.R.H. will pass through a Guard of Honour formed from the Scouts and Cubs of the Cuddington Troop. The Chairman of the Parish Council will then present Rev. Crawley-Bovey, Chairman, Playing Field Committee, who will present:-

H.R.H. will then be asked to mount a small platform. As H.R.H. ascends the stage "Three Cheers" will be called for, followed by the singing of "The Queen". The Chairman will give an address of welcome to H.R.H. H.R.H. will reply. H.R.H. will then plant a tree and officially open the Playing Field. H.R.H. will proceed through the Housing Estate, entering Aylesbury by the Wendover Road. H.R.H. will pass round the square to the entering of the Bull's Head Hotel.

The Mayoral car will lead the party from the inspection point, but will accelerate and draw away so as to enable the Mayor to reach the forecourt of the Bull's Head in time to be with the Lord Lieutenant and Reception Committee before the Duke arrives.

Extracts from speech to be delivered by LORD JUSTICE BIRKETT, P.C., (who lives in Buckinghamshire), proposing at luncheon the toast of The National Playing Fields Association coupled with the name of H.R.H. the President.

20

"We are met here to-day to do two things. The first is to proclaim the immensely valuable work of the National Playing Fields Association, and to invite the support and the co-operation of everybody in this county. It needs no words of mine to emphasise the vast importance of the work of the Association. Stated in its simplest form, the supreme object of all the activities of the Association is to provide adequate playing fields, properly equipped, for the present and future generations of every county in the land. What that means in pure enjoyment to millions who would otherwise be deprived of one of the chief pleasures of life is not to be measured in any words that I could employ to-day. But there is something more than enjoyment, important as I believe that element to be. The existence of adequate playing fields, in places where they are most needed, means a great accession of the true wealth of the nation in the health and physical well-being of the citizens, and in the building-up of a strong and virile race, ready to meet the challenging needs of the present day, and the still more challenging needs of the future.

"In this county, the Buckinghamshire Playing Fields Association, under the presidency of our distinguished and well-beloved Lord Lieutenant, Lord Cottesloe, is now well established. The financial stringency of the times has made the work of the Association increasingly difficult. The Ministry of Education has been compelled to reduce the amounts of its grants and indeed, to withold the making of any new Grents, although the parent Association has striven nobly to fill the breach. I am glad to say that 70 Local Authorities in Buckinghamshire are members of the County Association, and I would venture to make this three-fold appeal to-day. I would ask that ALL Local Authorities should become members; that every public-spirited organisation, particularly those concerned with the welfare of Youth both in work and play should do the same; and that all residents in the county

/should

should support the Association in carrying out the splendid work that is now being done.

"It is not often that I wish to be other than I am; but at this moment I could wish that I were either DING CROSHY or BOB HOPE or preferably both of them, with the power of appeal they both possess for the great work of the National Playing Fields Association; but that is not possible, I must rely on the impate generosity of all those who live in this delectable county.

"The second thing we are mot here to do is to pay tribute to the inspiring work of His Royal Highness as President of the Association, to thank him for fulfilling the rather laborious programme of to-day, and to assure him that his visit is widely and deeply appreciated, and to pleage our whole-hearted support of him in his great work.

"..... I am sure that this gathering would wish me to say with what pride and admiration they follow the great public work of His Royal Highness. He has made it abundantly olser that for him, public service is the test and the the goal. His work for the National Playing Fields Association is of course the work we particularly honour to-day; but we remember also how widespread are his manifold and multifarious activities. But whether it be with the Navy, or with the scholars and men of science, or in the mines, factories and workshops, gaining knowledge and understanding of the work of the nation, or taking his part in all those activities designed to exalt and stimulate the national spirit, or displaying the national sporting spirit as Cricketer or Polo Player, or making, be it observed, all these things serve his supreme purpose in the discharge of the duties of his explicated position - he exhibits the same human and attractive qualities which have so endeared him to the heart of the nation, and bound him to the people by the closest of bonds. He is, in the highest and best use of the words, a great public servant, and this country is exceedingly fortunate in having as a great Leader one of such versatility and of such devotion to the public welfare. He can "talk with crowds" and he can "Walk with Kings", but he remains the exemplar of all that is best and worthiest in our national traditions with a sure hold on the affections of all sorts and conditions of men."
