

QUEEN AT SHREWSBURY SCHOOL

The Queen, with the Duke of Edinburgh, drives through Shrewsbury after visiting the castle, before calling on the boys of Shrewsbury School who are celebrating the 4th centenary of the granting of their charter by Edward the Sixth. The Duke watches with a sailor's eye as the school's army cadets are inspected by Her Majesty.

With the Head Master, Her Majesty and the Duke make their way to a new terrace built to commemorate their visit. Now the Queen declares the terrace opened.

Mr. Petersen, the Head Master (himself an old boy of the school), calls for three cheers. Now Her Majesty leaves the terrace and walks to a playing field where the boys are assembled to give a display of physical training.

At the Queen's own request, the boys will have an extra three days Christmas holiday in honour of her visit.
