## IN THEIL WOR IN RESILA

At Government House, in Mairobi, capital of Kenya, Executive Members of the Council meet the Colonial Secretary, Mr. Oliver Lyttelten, to discuss means of ridding their colony of the Man Man. For in this land there is fear of those fanatical natives who aim to drive out the white man, and who have murdered many who stood in their path. Mr. Lyttelten visits the people who live in their dark shadow and, from Chief Mjiri, hears how his two fellow-chief tains were killed by the terrerists.

Mr. Lyttelton learns of the Man Man's threats on the lives of Cathelic missionaries - and, in the Myansa Province, he talks with Elders of the Kilmyn tribe, from which the Man Man draw hundreds of recruits, many of whom have now been arrested.

Britain has brought much good to Kenya. Her standards of living are growing still higher as more of her people learn the lessons that the white man has to teach. But if the Mau Man were to succeed in their mission, them (the natives fear) their colony might easily return to its former primitive state.

Continuing his tour to Munias, the Colonial Secretary is presented with a hand-carved steel as the natives' token of appreciation that the British people are deeply concerned with their troubles. Now Mr. Lyttelton returns to Britain to lay before the government his plans for ridding Kenya of the menace of the Mau Mau.
