

WESTMINSTER MEMORIAL WINDOW

At Westminster Hall, a huge stained-glass window has been erected to honour members and servants of both Houses of Parliament who died in the Second World War. Now in this solemn setting, a service of dedication is held, and the Prime Minister addresses the congregation:

"Indeed it is fitting that the Memorial window should stand in the oldest part of the Palace of Westminster and should overlook the birthplace of earliest Parliament of our land."

Designed by Sir Ninian Comper, the window incorporates the coats of arms and monograms of sixty-two men "whose names," Mr. Churchill said, "stir our hearts with pride and sorrow." A tribute to selfless sacrifice.
