

DUKE AT HARLOW NEW TOWN

The Duke of Edinburgh finds time during his busy programmes to visit Harlow New Town and to chat with workers who live on the brand new estate. They've a large rubber factory there already in production.

Situated twenty-three miles north-east of London, the New Town was started only three years ago. Already 1,500 dwellings have been built and now the Duke takes a look at them for himself. Shops, cinemas, offices - in fact everything for a modern town - are under construction, and it is hoped to finish the whole job in less than ten years. Children are provided for by the huge Glebelands playground, which they look after themselves. Now the Duke receives a jig-saw and a box of bricks, presents for the royal children from the people of Harlow.
