ROYAL CANADIAN NAVY SAILORS OF HMCS "ONTARIO" OBSERVE EQUATOR CROSSING RITUAL

NAVY CAMERAMAN RECORDS HILARIOUS INITIATION OF "TADPOLIS"

Aboard HMCS "Ontario"

October 00, 1952.

HMCS "Ontario", under the command of Captain E.P. Tisdall, C.D, RCN, is now engaged in a training and goodwill cruise to South America. During the passage the ship crossed the Equator and as is the custom of ships at sea, King Neptune and his Court boarded the 10,000 ton cruiser to initiate the "tadpoles" (those who have never crossed the line) into the solemn mysteries of "the Ancient Order of the Deep." This ceremony is witnessed with great flee by the "shellbacks". (the old salts who have made equatorial crossings before). equatorial crossings before).

The evening before the ship is due to cross the line, Davey Jones, King Neptune's Herald, appears on the forecastle with two bodyguards and announces that King Neptune will hold court the following day.

A tank is rigged and all preparations made. The usual procedure is for the "tadpole" to be seated on a stool with his back to the pool, after the charge and sentence of the Court for initiation ceremonies. This usually consists of lathering the man with all sorts of concoctions such as soft soap and corn meal as well as other evil smelling ingredients. The lather is applied with a six inch brush and then be is showed with an event wooden straight reserved. then he is shaved with an oversize wooden straight razor. Then the Royal Surgeon gives the man some foul tasting "pill".

Other "tortures" are often devised and when the rites are over the man is thrown back into the pool where the Bears, snarling and snorting, give him a thorough ducking. After that the man has graduated to a "shellback" and is later given a diploma stating that he has been admitted to the realm of King Neptune.

Should the man ever cross the line in another ship the only proof he has that he is a "shellback" is his diploma, and if he can't produce the evidence he is liable to the treatment over again.
