IKE

President-elect Eisenhower, accompanied by Mrs Eisenhower, lands in Washington for a whirlwind series of conferences with Mr Truman and others. Groundwork has already been done by Senator Lodge, Ike's chief liaison man, and GOP leaders, among them Senator Martin among them. Ike, in a double breasted suit, looks rested after his Georgia vacation.

Washington has turned out to welcome ^{the} President-elect. Half a million people stand in neat rows as Ike tours downtown Washington for half an hour on his way to the White House. Speculation runs high as to the subjects Ike will discuss with President Truman.

At the White House a record crowd of reporters waits for Ike as he appears with his budget liaison man Joseph Dodge and Senator Lodge. Alone Ike goes into his first post-election meeting with the President. It's reported that the conference was devoted mainly to the sphere of international relations. Both Ike and the President are said to agree on the fundamental approach to world problems. Then the Secretary of State Dean Acheson ..

called in by Mr. Truman, along with Defense Secretary Robert A. Lovett and other members of the outgoing cabinet.

Outside, newsmen wait during the hour and ten minute parley. Then Ike re-appears with Senator Lodge by his side, to tell reporters that one purpose of the meeting was: (LIVE SOUND)

With secret service men guarding him, Ike takes off for an unscheduled conference at the Pentagon, and his three hour, twenty eight minute Washington visit is near an end. At the airport Mamie and grandsons wait. At the Pentagon Ike's picked up Chief of Staff Bradley and is engaged in deep conversation with him, presumably about the coming trip to Korea. The take-off is announced, and like any commuter Ike sprints for the plane. He says he'll be back in Washington on January twentieth, then is off for New York.

At his New York headquarters Ike meets next with Senator Wiley of Wisconsin on Korea, then sees Representative Joe Martin, who may be new Speaker of the House. Senator Taft is on hand to discuss subjects for possible legislation by the new congress. With

Senator Styles Bridges, Ike and the GOP leaders map strategy on US and foreign problems facing the incoming administration.

John Foster Dulles arrives and Ike begins to name his cabinet. Dulles, an expert and an international law ~~specialist~~ chief architect of the Japanese peace treaty, will be secretary of state. Also named, though not present here, are Charles N. Wilson, secretary of defense, and Douglas McKay, Secretary of the Interior.

British Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden comes to see Ike on Korea.

After their conference, Eden tells the U.N. that Britain accepts India's proposal for a transfer of Korean prisoners to a neutral area for eventual disposition by a four-power commission. U.S. support of Britain comes as Ike on the national and international fronts Ike gets ready to take over.
