

GIANT U.S.A. STEEL PLANT

In Bucks County, Pennsylvania, a gigantic four thousand acre steel plant is ready to operate. Employees at the new works watch the first blast furnace lighted by Nancy Fairless, grand-daughter of American Steel Chairman Benjamin Fairless. "Nancy" is the name given to this furnace, one of many which will produce almost two million tons of steel each year.

Workers at this seventeen million pound plant live in the city of Levittown. This huge community (now being built at the rate of two hundred homes a week) is equipped with shops, schools, churches and railway stations and will soon become Pennsylvania's tenth largest city.

In the rolling hills of Bucks County, Pennsylvania, a new gigantic four thousand acre steel plant is ready to operate. Employees at the new Fairless Works watch as Nancy Fairless lights the first blast furnace. NANCY, granddaughter of U.S. Steel Chairman Benjamin Fairless, is the name given to this furnace, one of many which will produce almost two million tons of steel annually.

X Workers at the four hundred and fifty million dollar plant will live in this city of Levittown, specially constructed at the rate of two hundred homes per week. The community, complete with schools, churches, swimming pools, and railroad station, will soon be Pennsylvania's tenth largest city.
