

QUEEN AT LORD DALKEITH'S WEDDING

Twenty thousand people throng the streets of Edinburgh to see the arrival of the sixteen hundred guests attending the wedding of the Earl of Dalkeith and Miss Jane McNeill, at St. Giles Cathedral. Now the principal guests arrive: Her Majesty the Queen, the Duke of Edinburgh and Princess Margaret, who have journeyed from Sandringham specially for this joyous occasion.

The bride looks radiant in a gown of white French lace, embroidered in silver. Her waist-length tulle veil is held in place by a diamond tiara, lent to her by the Duchess of Buccleuch, the groom's mother.

The pipes herald the appearance of the bride and groom - now the Earl and Countess of Dalkeith. The happy couple are to spend their honeymoon in Corsica; but unfortunately, bad weather held up their aircraft and, instead, they set off on their journey by train. This is the only disappointment in a day that has seen the union of two of Scotland's most distinguished families.
