

SUFFOLKS LEAVE MALAYA

The people of Kuala Lumpur, capital of Malaya, bid farewell to men of the First Battalion, the Suffolk Regiment, who are leaving their country to go back to Blighty. At the station, the man under whose command they fought the jungle terrorists, General Sir Gerald Templer, is greeted by the Sultan Selanger, before he pays his personal tribute to the Fighting Suffolks. During their stay of three-and-a-half years in Malaya, these troops killed and wounded 183 terrorists. Twenty-four of their own men were wounded and twelve died in battle. Now the people for whom they fought and died give the Suffolks a rousing send-off as they leave on the first stage of their journey.

Already the county of Suffolk is making plans to give the boys of their own regiment a great welcome home.
