With Mr. Arthur Hillier, the Managing Director, the Duke makes a tour of the workshops where nearly four thousand men and women are employed and steps for a chat with many of them.

Guided missile control goar, automatic steering devices for ships and planes, gum centrol apparatus, and gyre compasses (here being put through severe tests) are all manufactured by this firm. During his therough tour through the factory, the Duke shows considerable technical knewledge of the equipment being made. A large proportion of the apparatus is experted all over the world.
