

DUKE VISITS GYRO WORKS

The Duke of Edinburgh inspects navigational aids (similar to those he used in war-time) at a factory in Brentford, Middlesex. With Mr. Arthur Hillier, the Managing Director, the Duke makes a tour of the workshops where nearly four thousand men and women are employed and stops for a chat with many of them.

Guided missile control gear, automatic steering devices for ships and planes, gun control apparatus, and gyre compasses (here being put through severe tests) are all manufactured by this firm. During his thorough tour through the factory, the Duke shows considerable technical knowledge of the equipment being made. A large proportion of the apparatus is exported all over the world.
