

VISCOUNT COWDRAY MARRIES

Twenty-five-year-old Elizabeth Jackson is helped by her father to prepare for her wedding to Viscount Cowdray at the tiny Crown Court Church in London's Covent Garden. One-time secretary to Mrs. Lewis Douglas, wife of the former American Ambassador, the bride arrives with her father and is greeted by a crowd of nearly a thousand.
