COCKELL BEATS FARR

At Nottingham, Temmy Parr (ence Britain's greatest beavyweight hope) takes on young Don Cockell in a twelve round elminator centest for the Heavyweight Championship of Great Britain. Temmy shows some of his old evasive eraft in the opening rounds.

Bruce Woodcook, the champion a few years ago, and Johnny Williams, the present title holder, see Gookell take command. Gookell is fourteen years younger than Farr, but if he's got the speed, the Welsh veteran's certainly got all the pluck in the world.

Ex-champ Jack Peterson sees Cockell throw a left - and Parr goes down. But he's soon back in battle again. Here's another eld-timer Jimmy Wilde. The fight enters the seventh round. Now it's Cockell's turn to hit the canvas - but only for a Second.

As Cockell slams away, Tommy covers up. He's been taking quite a beating. His left eye's badly out and he's pretty grossy on his feet as the bell goes for the end of the round.

Promoter Reg King watches the ref. end the fight and declare Cockell the winner. Farr protests that he can go on -but it's to no avail. He's in no fit state to continue. Tomay Farr, the man who nearly teppled Jee Louis off his threne fifteen years ago, proves the old maxim that they never come back. But he's game to the last and still refuses to retire.
