NARRIMAN LEAVES

ROME - March 12.

Queen Marriman of Egypt departed this afternoon for Eurich via TWA with her mother and a nurse, amid constradictory rumors that she was pregnant, separating from Farouk or taking steps to safeguard Egypt's ancient royal throne for their one-year-old baby King Fund II. She did not take Fund with her.

Shortly after her departure, a spokesman for ex-King Farouk blamed Egyptian "political elements" and Farouk's mother-in-law for her new leaving. Carle D'Amelio, the ousted Egyptian monarch's legal adviser, said Narriman's departure "was ably assisted by her mother who has evidently had contacts with Egyptian political elements". D'Amelio said the statement was issued with the approval of Farouk. It was the first official indication of a serious rift between the former Egyptian rulers. D'Amelio added that he did not know what Farouk's "next step would be".

The Queen, looking pale and worn in a blue sables cloth over a dark red dress, was greeted at the airport by Mrs. Anna D'Amelie and her young tall brunette daughters who have become intimated friends of the young Queen during her staying in Rome, and by Countess Peseri-Giraldi.

It was noticed that barrister Gino Sotis, a lawyer whose name is synonimous of "divorce" in Italy, left soon after, directed in Switzerland.
