ROLL ONE - Weaving Cloth of gold - see handout all details - Alfred Fuller aged 16 $\frac{1}{2}$  weaves one yard per day.  
Bill Beard age 69, been with Warners 57 $\frac{1}{2}$  years, now working on his fourth Coronation. He is seen "twisting" the 28,800 silk threads needed for the Crimson damask for the throne. Normal speed and then in slow motion.

ROLL TWO - Patricia Weavers aged 19 in charge of a power loom weaving the "Queensway" material for the Abbey drapings.  
Mr. Eccles, Minister of Works talking to Joyce Pidgeon 22, also in charge of a power loom making similar drapings. C.U's of Crown being woven.
