Dag Hammarskjöld is chosen as the United Nations' Secretary General. The result of the secret ballot was a foregone conclusion as Mr. Vishinsky previously had announced his support.

Pearson:

"I declare therefore the recommendation of the Security Council that the appointment of Mr. Dag Hammarskjöld accepted."

Resigning from the post as Secretary General, Mr. Trygve Lie says farewell:

"I thank you for all the kind words, all your support and all your understanding during the past seven years. If I have made mistakes, I hope you will forgive me and I will certainly forgive you."

After a final round of personal farewells, Mr. Lie leaves for the airport to greet his Swedish successor to the U.N.'s top administrative post.

William Howard Taft is sworn in by Secretary of State John Foster Dulles as American Ambassador to Ireland. William Taft, son of Robert Taft, who conceded Presidential victory to Eisenhower, receives a kiss of congratulation from his mother. For many years, the new ambassador has taken a lively interest in Ireland's affairs.

United Nations delegates from twenty-six countries discuss the future of the International Emergency Fund which will end in eight months unless new appropriations are voted. Millions of youngsters of seventy-two nations and territories have been restored to health by UNICEF. In remote areas, where even pack mules can't go, vital nutritious foodstuffs make the United Nations a symbol of hope for all.
