7 DIE IN U.S. 'PLANE CRASH

A missing twin-engine DC-3, carrying twenty-three American soldiers, is finally located by search planes in a heavy forest area forty miles south of Seattle. The thick foliage helped to cushion the aircraft when it crashed, but many are found badly injured by doctors who were parachuted in.

Amongst the wreckage, rescuers find the bodies of the pilot, the co-pilot and five passengers. Survivors tell how the pilot sacrificed his life to make a successful crash landing when one engine failed. A shuttle service of helicopters speeds the wounded to an emergency hospital. Eighteen of the twenty-five aboard the ill fated aircraft are saved, thanks to their heroic pilot and to those who parachuted in so readily to give them aid.
