

Subject: First exchange of wounded P.O.Ws.
Place: Panmunjom.
Cameraman: Gene Zenier and Kim Wee.

- Roll 1: (Munsan) Train arriving at Munsan at 5a.m. which is loading wounded N. Korean Communists. Then P.O.Ws being unloaded from train at TASP to ambulance for ride to Panmunjom.
- Roll 2. By side of train, many ambulances are waiting. N. Korean P.O.Ws unloading from train and getting on those ambulances.
(Above two rolls were shot in rain).
- Roll 3. First 40' shot of Communist P.O.Ws transferred to ambulance. Train of ambulances carrying N. Korean P.O.Ws to Panmunjom passing Freedom Bridge.
- Roll 4. Gen. Clark, U.N. Commander in Chief, Gen. Weyland, Chief of Far East Air Force, Lt. Gen. Taylor, Commander of Eighth Army, Lt-Gen. Harrison, Chief U.N. delegation to Armistice Talk, and Gen. Barcus, Commander of 5th Air Force are getting off the train at TASP and watching the N. Korean P.O.Ws being transferred to ambulance.
- Roll 5. At Freedom village, first U.N. P.O.Ws are carried back on 'copter and 5 top ranking officers are entering into tent where the U.N. P.O.Ws are evacuated for the first treatment. Pfc. Robert C. Stell happened to be the first returned prisoner being interviewed.
- Roll 6. Ambulances from Panmunjom arriving at Freedom Village loading many U.N. P.O.Ws. They are greeted by Gen. Clark and Gen. Taylor.
- Roll 7. Ali Biler, Robert C. Stell and John P. Porter are carried on stretchers to helicopter. Kirchausen (left) and Donald Legay are being interviewed by press. Also shows Cpl. Kenyon Wagner of Detroit, Mich, and another Greek Soldier.

General Mark Clark, Commander of U.S. and U.N. forces in Far East, arrives in Korea to witness the return of the first allied sick and wounded prisoners released by the Communists under the P.O.W. exchange agreement signed recently.

Clark headed a large array of top ranking officers who gathered at this advance U.N. truce camp to see the boys come back.

It was the largest gathering of top ranking commanders in one place since the visit of President Eisenhower last December.

POW EXCHANGE STARTED:

ALLIED SICK AND WOUNDED AMONG THEM 14 AMERICANS IN THE FIRST 50 CROSSED THE LINE FROM COMMUNISM TO FREEDOM TODAY AT PAMMUJOM. SOME WERE SMILING AND SOME WERE CRYING AS THEY LIMPED BACK. THE FIRST ALLIED PRISONER WAS HANDED OVER BY THE COMMUNISTS AT 8:5 AND THE LAST OF 50 SOUTH KOREANS AND 50 NON KOREANS STEPPED ONTO FREE SOIL AT 11:30 A.M.

HELICOPTERS LEFT THE RETURNED PRISONERS AND WHIRLED THE FIRST DOWN THE ROAD TO FREEDOM VILLAGE AT ~~2:30~~ 9:59 A.M.

THE INITIAL EXCHANGE PROGRESSED SMOOTHLY. NO EXPRESSION SHOWED IN THE AGES OF SOUTH KOREANS BEING RETURNED.

MOST AMERICAN AND BRITISH SICK AND WOUNDED WERE JOKING AND SMILING AS THEY SAT IN AMBULANCES AWAITING THE GREAT MOMENT OF EXCHANGE.

ALL FOUR ROLLS INCLUDE SEVERAL SCENE AT THE PAMMUJOM EXCHANGE SITE OF POWS.
