KING HUSSEIN ENTHROUGH

For three days, the city of Amman, the capital of Jerdan, celebrates the enthremement of King Hussein. 100,000 Arabs cheer the reyal parade, as the king is driven to Parliament House for the ceremony and to take the cath.

Within Parliament House, the Prime Minister effers the leyalty of his fellow countrymen. Before his counsellors, the King takes the eath and wows to uphold the constitution and to be loyal to the nation, and, in a brief speech, refers to the heavy task which faces the armies of Jordan.

The king leaves Parliament after the coremony and with a bearing that tells of his Sandhurst training, inspects a guard of henour. King Hussein, who was a scholar at Harrow, has already instilled in his people a new hope, bern of his country's increasing national unity.
