

DUKE WITH COLONIAL TROOPS

At Woolwich, the Duke of Edinburgh, inspects men of the Aden Protectorate, who will form part of the two-mile procession which will accompany the Queen back to the Palace after her crowning.

The inspection over, the Duke leaves by helicopter. These aerial trips straight to and from the lawn of Buckingham Palace have already saved the Duke many hours in his travels. At Pirbright he inspects two thousand Commonwealth troops - among them men of the Royal Canadian Navy.

Men from Pakistan are on parade, alongside those from Southern Rhodesia; now a detachment of the Royal Papuan-New Guinea Constabulary are reviewed by the Duke.

The gallant Gurkhas, too, will join the great procession on Coronation Day.
