- and Hole's caught behind the wicket! England are really on top, but de Courcy threatens to stop the collapse.

Wardle to de Coursy - and Godfrey Evans has got him! A beautiful bit of stumping. Australia 31 for 5. Old Trafford hasn't seen anything like this for a very long time.

England get set for another - Johnny Wardle bowls to Harvey - and he's got him.

31 for 6 now, and Archer's out! L. B. W. bowled Wardle for a duck. That makes it 31 for 7. A splendid job by Wardle. Now he bowls to Lindwall.

Lindwall's wicket gives Wardle the magnificent figures of four wickets for only seven runs. Stumps, and the match, are drawn with Australia at 35 for 8. The Aussies have taken a heavy tumble at long last.
