FOOD FOR E. BERLINERS.

East Berliners form long queues in the Western sector of the city where they are now entitled to buy vital foodstuffs which are in short supply in their own Russian-controlled zone. Since the Reds lifted the boundary barriers, crowds of East Berliners clutching ration books invade the West each day, for now the authorities have allowed them to make purchases with notes issued by the Russians.

Fresh milk is supplied from farms in Western Germany. Now President Eisenhower has reaffirmed the desire of the American people to send more food into the Russian zone. The Soviet Government has refused to permit direct entry, but Dr. Adenauer, the German Federal Chancellor, has promised to do his best to pass on the supplies by every channel open to him.
