

FOURTH TEST MATCH - LEEDS.

Australia take the field at Headingley, Leeds, for the fourth Test Match, ready for Len Hutton and Bill Edrich, England's opening pair. A crowd of 30,000 watch speed merchant Ray Lindwall bowl to Hutton.

Hutton gets ready for the next from Lindwall, who's not worked up to top speed yet.

And Lindwall draws first blood. The second ball of the match splays Hutton's stumps. England nought for one wicket - the incomparable Hutton out for a duck. There couldn't be a sadder blow for Yorkshiremen. Now Lindwall turns his attentions to Bill Edrich.

One run that time, so its Lindwall now to Graveney.

A four all the way.

Edrich, who's scored ten so far, faces Keith Miller.

- and Edrich is out L.B.W. Miller claps his hands with excitement as his victim makes the long journey back to the pavilion, England 33 for 2. Next man in is Edrich's old partner, Denis Compton. Lindwall bowls to him -

and he's out, caught by Davidson behind the wicket for a duck. It's becoming quite a procession. England are really in trouble - three of their best out for 36.

Bensud bowls to Willie Watson who's quickly in his stride and scoring comfortably.

Watson and Graveney raise England's hopes with a sound partnership. Here's Graveney in action again.

Graveney gets set for another from Lindwall.

and there's his fifty up! A fine, polished innings despite the failure of most of his partners. Graveney looks like one of England's best finds in years.

But its not long before the rain comes - and Graveney goes, caught by Bensud off Miller for 55. The Aussies may well congratulate themselves. Next man in is Reg Simpson.

But a fast ball hits his left elbow, and Simpson has to retire hurt. Only a few moments later there's another tragedy. Willie Watson takes a nasty crack on the foot, and loses his wicket to Lindwall. England's casualty list mounts - that's more that can be said for the score. Five wickets are down for only 108.

Perhaps the biggest tragedy comes when Evans sends Bailey back as he tries a quick run.
