List of shots. ROLL I first 50
or 60 ft was of previous demon-
stration & was not sent as it
was insufficient. This section
has been marked with a nick
in side of film - it is "head in."
Not of use because the route
and venue was not included
today. Except O'Connell Bridge
and I did not arrive in time
on previous dem. to include.

Shot I (22/7/53) Demonstrators
approach historic G.P.O (1916) &
display flag of Dublin Citizen
Army. This flag is the
Plough (the starry one) on
a field of blue and
dates from the labour troubles
of 1912 and 1913. It is much
respected in Ireland.

They then marched on up
O'Connell St, turned at end,
Came back & sat down on
both sides of the main bridge
in the city. (2nd series of
shots after C.P.O. follows)

Shows them marching onto
bridge, on left side, wheeling
at top & coming down other
side. Then they sit down.

- Leader Thomas Pearle has
fair hair, slight build &
march centre front rank.
He sits at head of dems.
Shots - S.C.V. of Civic Guards
& plain clothes man beseeches
Pearle to pack up & go
but he refuses. follows
L.S. Elevated general view
of scene. follows ground
shots again. follows shot
of Civic Guard Sgt. coming

towards me to "warn me off"
 Shots of demonstrators on
 ground chanting "we want
 work" etc. After this
 I got word they would march
 on the Dail so I went
 there & got shot (slight
 elevation from a parapet)
 of demonstrators coming up
 Kildare Street (where Dail
 is) follows scene around
 the big gates shot from top
 of pillar box. Gates closed.
 Military police in side, but
 gates at ground level so dense
 could not get C.V. of them
 - in any event police were
 trying to stop me, so went
 to house overlooking scene.
 end ROLL I.
 Roll II about 50 or 70 ft

of L.S.'s. of scene around
 gates. End of meeting
 with three cheers.

Points for your consideration.
 Demonstrations are NON political.
 The men want work no matter
 who is in power.

It is the first time ever
 that any demonstration
 reached the Dail. ~~But~~
 But Dail was not sitting.
 merely a token victory.
 Demonstrators have large
 numbers of ex-servicemen
 as stewards & are well disciplined.
