*Can Gordon to cover with build up*

A new form of angling competition, which has become a tal point for anglers throughout the country, is to be launched on Satu July, 25, by Bernard Venables, the famous author, artist and broadc whose books on angling have had immense sales, and who is now Edito Director of "ANGLING TIMES", the new national angling weekly.

The competition consists of the release of a number of per in various popular angling centres throughout the country, each fish bearing a numbered tag in its gill cover. The first angler to catch one of these perch will win a prize of £20, awarded by "ANGLING TIMES", and further prizes for the second, third and fourth fish to be caught will be £10, £5, and £3, and a 5/- tackle voucher to all other captors of the tagged perch. In addition, for every tagged fish caught, the "ANGLING TIMES" will present £3 to the Anglers Co-operative Association, which fights legal battles on behalf of anglers against pollution.

The first release of the fish will take place at Canbury Gardens, Kingston, Surrey, when anglers from many parts of London, Surrey and Middlesex will see the tags affixed to the opercular bone (gill cover) of at least fifty perch, which will then be released into the river by Bernard Venables. Prominent London angling club officials will help with the tagging, the method used being that approved by the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.
