ROYAL SCOT CRASHES.

By a miracle no-one was killed when four coaches of the Boyal Soot were depailed while the crack express was travelling at marry severely miles an hour. It is thought that the heat of the sun expended and warped the rails on the track near Abington, 44 miles south of Glangous As the train began to sway, the driver slamed on the brokes, stopping it in about 400 yards - a quarter of the usual distance.

The safety couplings between coaches, which absorbed most of the violent shock as the train halted, did much to step the train telescoping. Although they evertured, the coaches, unde of steel, suffered comparatively little damps. Only seventeen people were injured in which might well have been one of the most terrible disasters in railway history.
