M. MALENKOV WENT ON TO OUTLINE THE RELATIONS WITH INDIVIDUAL COUNTRIES.

DEALING WITH GERMANY, HE SAID THAT THE RISING IN EAST GERMANY ON JUNE 17TH WAS A PROVOCATION OF THE WEST.

"THE WESTERN POWERS", HE ADDED, "ARE OUT TO REMILITARISE AND THEREBY TO DESTROY GERMANY. THE WEST WANTS US TO AGREE TO THE REMILITARISATION OF GERMANY. BUT OUR PEOPLE DID NOT SHED THEIR BLOOD IN THE WAR TO FOSTER A NEW AGGRESSOR. WE SHALL, ON THE OTHER HAND, MAKE EVERY EFFORT TO BRING ABOUT THE UNIFICATION OF A PEACE-LOVING GERMANY".

HE THOUGHT THAT A SETTLEMENT OF THE GERMAN QUESTION WOULD GREATLY HELP THE SETTLEMENT OF THE AUSTRIAN PROBLEM.

8.35 PM ADD: M MALENKOV.

ON RUSSIA'S SOUTHERN FRONTIERS RELATIONS WITH IRAN WERE GOOD AND NEIGHBOURLY. TRADE BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES WAS EXPANDING AND THERE WAS EVERY CHANCE OF A SUCCESSFUL SETTLEMENT OF FRONTIER AND FINANCIAL QUESTIONS. RUSSIA'S RELATIONS WITH AFGHANISTAN WERE STABLE AND SATISFACTORY. THE RECENT IMPROVEMENT OF RELATIONS WITH TURKEY WOULD NO DOUBT CONTRIBUTE TO A STABILISATION OF THE SITUATION IN THE BALKAN STATES.

THE EXISTING TREATY OF FRIENDSHIP AND ALLIANCE WITH FINLAND WOULD GUARANTEE PEACE IN NORTHERN EUROPE.

TURNING TO ISRAEL, HE SAID, "THE SOVIET GOVERNMENT HAS RECENTLY AGREED TO A REINSTATEMENT OF DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS WITH ISRAEL, PROVIDING ISRAEL DOES NOT JOIN ANY AGGRESSIVE BLOC. THIS RENEWAL OF DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS WILL IN NO WAY, AS SPECULATED BY THE WESTERN PRESS, MEAN A DETERIORATION OF RELATIONS WITH THE ARAB COUNTRIES".

8.42 PM ROYAL SCOT CRASHES.

SEVENTEEN PERSONS WERE INJURED AND TAKEN TO HOSPITAL WHEN THE LAST FOUR COACHES OF THE TEN O'CLOCK ROYAL SCOT FROM EUSTON LEFT THE RAILS SOON AFTER PASSING ABINGTON, 44 MILES FROM GLASGOW, AT ABOUT 5.32 THIS AFTERNOON.

8.46 PM ADD: ROYAL SCOT CRASHES.

SEVENTEEN PERSONS WERE INJURED AND TAKEN TO LAW HOSPITAL, HAMILTON, WHEN THE LAST FOUR COACHES OF THE 10 O'CLOCK ROYAL SCOT FROM EUSTON LEFT THE RAILS AFTER PASSING ABINGTON, 44 MILES FROM GLASGOW AT ABOUT 5.32 THIS AFTERNOON.

8.51 PM      ADD:    ROYAL SCOT.

NO ONE WAS KILLED.

TRAINS TO AND FROM ENGLAND ARE BEING DIVERTED VIA  
KILMARNOCK AND DUMFRIES.

IT IS NOT EXPECTED THAT THE OBSTRUCTION WILL BE CLEARED BEFORE  
TOMORROW AFTERNOON.

10.5 PM ADD: ROYAL SCOT.

A NUMBER OF TRAINS TO AND FROM EDINBURGH HAVE HAD TO BE DIVERTED TO OTHER ROUTES AS A RESULT OF THE ACCIDENT.

TRAINS FROM PRINCES STREET STATION ON THE WEST COAST ROUTE TO MANCHESTER PROCEEDED TO CARLISLE AND THEN ON THE OLD L.N.E.R. ROUTE THROUGH LOCKERBIE AND HAWICK.

SOME NORTH-BOUND TRAINS WERE DIVERTED AT CARLISLE AND PROCEEDED TO THE WAVERLEY STATION, EDINBURGH, INSTEAD OF PRINCES STREET.

IT WAS STATED AT LAW HOSPITAL, HAMILTON, TONIGHT, THAT THE SEVENTEEN PERSONS WHO WERE INJURED IN THE ROYAL SCOT CRASH WERE "FAIRLY COMFORTABLE".

NONE OF THE PATIENTS WAS SERIOUSLY INJURED.

10.7 PM SUPREME SOVIET APPROVES BERIA DISMISSAL.

MOSCOW RADIO REPORTS THAT AFTER M. MALENKO'S SPEECH THE SUPREME SOVIET UNANIMOUSLY ADOPTED THE LAW ON THE 1953 BUDGET AND THE LAW ON THE REDUCTION OF THE AGRICULTURAL TAX BY 43 PER CENT.

THE SUPREME SOVIET ALSO RATIFIED THE DECREE OF THE DISMISSAL OF BERIA FOR "CRIMINAL AND ANTI-STATE ACTIVITIES" AND APPROVED THE APPOINTMENT OF KRUGLOV AS HIS SUCCESSOR AS THE MINISTER FOR INTERNAL AFFAIRS.

OTHER CHANGES IN THE GOVERNMENT WERE:-

KOSYACHENKO WAS RELIEVED OF HIS POST AS CHAIRMAN OF THE STATE PLANNING COMMISSION AND WAS REPLACED BY SABUROV.

THE PROCURATOR GENERAL, SAPRONOV, WAS REPLACED BY RUDENKO.

THE MINISTRY FOR MACHINE INDUSTRIES WHICH AFTER STALIN'S DEATH WAS CREATED FROM SEVERAL RELATED MINISTRIES, HAS NOW BEEN SPLIT INTO A MINISTRY FOR HEAVY MACHINERY HEADED BY OKOPOV, AND A MINISTRY FOR MEDIUM MACHINE BUILDING HEADED BY MALYSHEV.

THE SESSION OF THE SUPREME SOVIET FINISHED AFTER THE RATIFICATION OF THESE DECREES.

10.20 PM ADD: ROYAL SCOT.

THE ACCIDENT HAPPENED JUST AFTER THE EXPRESS HAD PASSED UNDER A NARROW BRIDGE.

SOME OF THE TRACK WAS TORN UP WHEN THE FOUR REAR COACHES JUMPED THE RAILS.

FARMERS' WIVES LIVING NEAR THE SCENE OF THE ACCIDENT WENT TO THE ASSISTANCE OF THE PASSENGERS IN THE FOUR REAR COACHES.

AFTER THE DERAILMENT PASSENGERS IN THE FRONT PORTION OF THE TRAIN LEFT THEIR COACHES AND HELPED TO EXTRICATE THOSE IN THE OVERTURNED COACHES.

10 29 PM            ADD: ROYAL SCOT.

A NUMBER OF THE PASSENGERS SUFFERED FROM SHOCK AND CUTS FROM FLYING GLASS. THESE WERE TREATED BY LOCAL RESIDENTS.

AT THE TIME OF THE ACCIDENT A MEAL WAS BEING SERVED IN THE DINING CAR.

THE KITCHEN CAR OF THE ROYAL SCOT WAS ONE OF THE COACHES THAT LEFT THE RAILS.

TWO OF THE STAFF WERE AMONG THOSE INJURED. ONE WAS THE CHEF MR WILLIAM FRANK SMITH, OF HEMSTAL ROAD, WEST HAMPSTEAD HE RECEIVED A BADLY GASHED HAND.

1-12 AM. ADD ROYAL SCOT .

IT IS NOW LEARNED THAT SEVEN PASSENGERS ARE DETAINED IN HOSPITAL. THEY ARE STATED TO BE NOT SERIOUSLY INJURED.

TWELVE MORE PASSENGERS RECEIVED HOSPITAL TREATMENT AND WERE ALLOWED TO GO HOME.

TEN PEOPLE WERE TREATED FOR MINOR INJURES ON THE SCENE OF THE DERAILMENT .

2.2 AM.. FRENCH ECONOMY REFORMS  
PARIS SATURDAY.

EIGHTEEN OUT OF 27 ECONOMY REFORMS AND OTHER MEASURES AIMED AT PUTTING THE FINANCES OF THE STATE IN ORDER, AND REVIVING ECONOMIC ACTIVITIES, WERE ADOPTED AFTER A FIVE HOUR SITTING OF THE FRENCH CABINET TODAY.

THE REMAINDER ARE EXPECTED TO BE ADOPTED TOMORROW, AND ALL THE MEASURES WILL BE PUBLISHED OFFICIALLY ON MONDAY.

2.11 AM.. PARIS ADD REFORMS.

M. PIERRE FERRI, MINISTER OF POSTS AND TELEGRAPHS, STATED TONIGHT THAT 80,000 OUT OF THE 220,000 POSTAL WORKERS WERE STILL ON STRIKE.

THE REQUISITION ORDERS ISSUED ON THURSDAY WERE TO BE OBSERVED, THE MINISTER ADDED, BUT A SECOND ORDER HAD BEEN ISSUED THROUGHOUT FRANCE WARNING THE POSTAL WORKERS TO OBEY THEM IF THEY FAILED TO REPORT FOR DUTY. AN INDEPENDENT RAILWAY UNION ORDERED ITS MEMBERS TO OBEY THE ORDER TONIGHT.
