100 AMERICAN EXCHANGE TEACHERS ARRIVING AT SOUTHAMPTON

100 American exchange teachers, some with wives and children, are due to arrive at Southampton aboard the S.S. United States at 3 p.m. on Wednesday next, 12th August.

These teachers have exchanged posts with an equivalent number of British teachers under the teacher interchange scheme administered by the British Interchange Committee and the Ministry of Education. They will teach for one year in schools in this country. The British teachers are now en route for the U.S.A.

On arrival at Southampton the American teachers will be greeted by the Mayor of Southampton and the Sheriff, the Directors of Education for Southampton and Portsmouth, Mr. William Morris, representing the Cultural Department of the American Embassy, the American Consul at Southampton and Dr. E.A. Ford, Chairman and Director of the British Committee for the Interchange of Teachers between the United Kingdom and the United States of America, will also be present.
