## PERSIAN REVOLT.

Attention is focused once again on the Middle Hast where events in Iran have taken a dramatic double twist. Forced to flee his palace in Teheran, the Shah and his Queen agrive in Rose after an alleged attempt by the Imperial Guard to agreet Doctor Messadeq and a refusal by the Shah to dissolve Parliament at Messadeq's request.

In Teheran it looked as if Messadeq would soon be named President and on his orders troops occupied the Sheh's palaces and surrounded Parliament. And then the people themselves took a hand.

Mossadeq and his government were swept from power in favour of General Eshedi the man appointed by the Shah in the first place. Perced to abanden what we had created in the wilderness, is it too much to hope that we shall see once more the tankers of Britain at Abadan? Maybe sanity will yet prevail, and Iran and Britain go forward in Marmony.
