GERMAN ATHLETES BEAT BRITONS.

German athletes get set to take on a British team at the Olympia Stadium in Berlin in the first match between the two countries since the war. The Germans are soon well ahead but Geoffrey Elliott wins the pole vault for Britain. One of the highlights of the meeting is the 1,500 metres. Chief headache for the British entrants is the world record holder, Werner Lueg. That's him in fourth place, just behind Nankeville. Seaman of Great Britain is in the lead, with Lamers close on his heels.
