The National Exhibition of Children's Art gets the sort of send-off that young artists can really appreciate. With Sir John Rothenstein and other artexperts they're tucking into the Sunday Pictorial's reward for their efforts with pencil and paint. Hundreds of children from five to seventeen have contributed to the display. Here in a London gallery, is all the charm and freshness of childhood, the daring and colour of youth.

Through the eyes of a child we see the Coronation. Now the "Conquest of Everest?"

The Mummy and Daddy of seven year old Barrie Jones - the figure of a Russian witch by little Derek Chaplin - here is the fantastic world of a child, bright, alive and confident - a version of our own yesterdays.
