Douglas, the picturesque seaside capital of the Isle of Man, is the setting for 1953's Trades Union Congress. Nearly a thousand delegates get set for what promises to be an even livelier session than usual. Welcome guests come from Burma and Indonesia. Chairman this year is Tom O'Brien, who looks after cinema employees' welfare. Other notable T.U.C. personalities present include the Transport workers' champion, Sir Arthur Deakin, and Sir William Lawther, the MINERS' Leader.
