Barry in his police service he was stationed in the large industrial Borough of Part Talbet, where he experienced the rigours and hardships of the best for a paried of four years. The training of a young Police Officer in these days was perfunctory, but with a readinase of mind he patterned his methods of dealing with the public and the perfurences of his detice on those devoted and trusted senior Officers under when he served, and from when he learnt that that and industry were essential ingredients in the make up of a successful Police Officer,

The experience he gained as a 'best efficer' was an added qualification for administrative detics at the Headquarters of the Perce, and in June of 1904, he was singled out for clarical detics in the Chief Constable's Office where he quietly assimilated the details of the structure of the Force by graduating through its various departments.

His ability for organization and his interest in the walfare and officient of the Perce were recognized by all runhs from Constable to Imposter in that he was chosen as their representative as he passed through those runhs himself. Under his guidance the Glub, in the last two years, here developed from a meribuni state into full activity in all breastes of sport. The Reghy Section so well known throughout England and Vales is fast recepturing its old glaries, and many charitable organizations in the administrative County are remaining, and will receive, financial help from the proceeds of police metabos.

Since taking command of the Perce two years ago, the Chief Constable has created an atmosphere of good will enough his Officers and men who feel fortified by new bonds of constability, fresh implication and a decire to make a definite contribution to the reputation of the Perce.

He has also secured the confidence and ec-speration of the public by his integrity, importiality and sense of fairyley, and it is an inspiring thought that the Glamorgan Police, in these times of change and alcowage, are ready to play their part in the preservation and reinforcement of those legalities, ideals and principles which find their expression in the character of the Police Service.
