Brivers Avenus in Sydmey is the starting-off-point for the round Anstralia car rally. 63 year old Grandma Commay gets set to tackle some of the roughest, dusticat roads they've get down-under. There are 6,500 miles ahead of them, and obstacles all along the route. 68 of the hundred and minety two cars in the race are British-made, and they're up against keen competition from French, Italian, American and Australians entrants.

- and there's a easualty? Driver Jack Murray is unhurt, except in pride. The rally route takes the cars from Sydney to Brisbane, on to Darwin, Adelaide, Melbeurne - and then back to Sydney again, where a £1,000 in each awaits the winner. At Darwin, they all step for refreshment, but the rules forbid them to do any work at all on their cars.

Granus Conway has a last one for the road - and then its back to the bumps. Now the final result has been accounced: A French car snatched victory By only one point from a Super Snipe.
