LABOUR CONFERENCE - MARGATE.

Margate, Kent's number one holiday resort, opens its doors to twelve hundred delegates taking part in the fifty second annual conference of the Labour Party. Here for the meeting at the Winter Gardens are Tom Williams, James Griffiths, Dr. Samuel, and under the hat, Dr. Edith Summerskill.

With his wife Jennie Lee is Aneurin Bevan, the fiery-tongued crusader against Conservatism whose followers have threatened to split away from Mr. Attlee and his supporters. Also with his wife is Mr. Emmanuel Shinwell.

Chatting together are Alderman Joe Reeves and Mr. Harold Wilson.

Declaring the conference open is Mr. Arthur Greenwood, still firmly in place after his post as chairman of the national executive was challenged by Herbert Morrison. Following his withdrawal from the duel, Mr. Morrison retires among the audience. In the fierce speech, Mr. Bevan demands that Sir Winston Churchill should retire from his post of Premier, if he is still unwell. But Bevan, tipped as a future premier himself, plays safe with the Labour delegates and seems determined to offend none of them - least of all his opponent-ally, Mr. Attlee. In a spirited speech, Mr. Attlee too says nothing that might upset the Bevanites. Co-operation not division, seems the theme at Margate.
