NUREMBERG BOMB SCARE.

An unexploded two ton bomb, dropped by the R.A.F. on Nuremberg during the war, brings the city where the Hitler gang went on trial back into the limelight again. Thousands of people leave their homes under police supervision - just in case.

A bomb disposal squad begins the dangerous work of rendering the giant harmless. In charge are Erich Froderman and Richard Hesse, two veterans at this type of work. During the war years this couple successfully dealt with ten similar black-busters, and they haven't lost their old touch yet.
