COMPLETE DESCRIPTION OF SCENES

Duke's plane, piloted by himself arrives at Lamsberg Airport. Duke leaves plane is greeted by A.O.C. and Station Commander. At Wyvern Barracks, where the 8th. King's Royal Irish Hussars are stationed, the Commanding Officer, Lt.Col. Sir W.S. Lowther, asks the Duke to inspect the Parade. The Colonel is mounted on his charger as a link with the days before the Regiment was mechanised. Shot of an 8th. Hussar in the Dress Uniform. (New not worn). Close shots of men on parade. Shots of the Duke inspecting the parade, talking to the men etc. General View of the parade. Another shot of the mounted Hussar. Walking shot of the Duke with Col. Lowther. March Past of the Regiment. led by Col. Lowther on his charger. He canter by to symbolise a march past of mounted Hussars. Three cheers are given for the Colonel-in-Chief after he has said a few words to the men. Walking shot of the Duke and the Colonel. Duke sees Tank ~~parade~~ Parade.....this consists of Emergency Reservists spotting on miniature range. Features of Tank mechanism are explained to the Duke. The Duke leaves.

Gen. Sir Frederick Browning accompanied the Duke. Duke assumed the Colonel-in-Chief on June 2nd. 1953. The 8th. Hussars is the only armoured regiment of which the Duke is Colonel-in-Chief.

The Regiment's last mounted parade was in Cairo in 1955. 190 of the men on parade were in Korea with the Regiment. The Regiment has 25% Natinal Servicemen. After their return from Korea, the Regiment was officially affiliated to the 3rd. Battalion The Royal Australian Regiment...the first time in history that a cavalry regiment has been affiliated to a Dominion Infantry Battalion. The Duke will carry a gift to the Australian Regiment from the 8th. Hussars when he goes to Australia. This affiliation took place as result of an action in Korea in October 1951, when the Regiment climbed the Korean mountains in Centurion Tanks and were able to give the infantry effective support.
