DUKE OF EDINBURGH IN GERMANY.

The Duke of Edinburgh flies into Lüneburg Airport from Britain, on a fleeting visit to men of the 8th King's Royal Hussars. At Wyvern Barracks, where they are stationed, 400 Hussars parade for inspection by the Duke who, as their Colonel in Chief, wears the battledress uniform of the regiment.

190 of the men on parade saw action in Korea - a new battle-honour to add to the many the Hussars won when they mounted horses, not tanks, to ride to war. "If all the army is like you, there is nothing wrong with the army" says the Duke before he pilots his aircraft home again to Britain.

QUEEN MOTHER IN ABERDEEN OPENS NEW ALUMINIUM BRIDGE.

The Queen Mother is welcomed by Lord Aberdeen and the Lord Provost, J.M. Graham, when she visits the Granite City of Aberdeen. At the harbour, near the entrance to Victoria Dock, the Queen Mother, who wears a dress and matching coat of lavender, opens a new bridge which spans the mouth of the dock. Built almost entirely of aluminium alloy, it is only the second bascule bridge in the world to be made of this material.

To complete the ceremony, a strip of aluminium stretched across the entrance to the bridge is cut by the Queen Mother.

The Queen Mother is the first to walk across the bridge she named St. Clement's Bridge.
