Promoter Joe Jacobs watches closely as the Italian nearly takes a tumble, trying to avoid the sledgehaumer punches Cockell's throwing. A blacksmith from Battersea, Cockell, misses with a right that could have brought the fight to a full-step.

Bacilieri opens up and Cockell uses the ropes to counter-attack. Up to the half-way mark, the points are mainly in the Britisher's favour. A cut eye won't help the Italian, but its Cockell who hits the Canvas first as a slip sends him floundering.

Quickly back on his feet, Cockell batters into his opponent, but he just won't go down. He's taken a packet of punishment. Into the last round.
