LOWESTOFT - MAVAL DRAD HONOURED.

At Lowestoft stands a graceful column fifty feet high, topped by a bronse Model galleon - a splendid memerial to personnel of the Royal Naval Patrol Service who gave their lives during the way. Here to perform the unveiling ecremony is Admiral of the Fleet Sir Rhoderick McGrigor. Here too to pay their tribute are fishermen, many of whom saw active service in Mavy patrol boats. Relatives of those who died watch the memerial unveiled;

The Guard of Honour presents arms as the names of their dead comrades are revealed.

In stone their memory is cherished - the men who sailed the mine - sweepers, corvettes and other little ships that kept our island guarded from the enemy. Sir Rhoderick McGrigor lays a wreath, token of gratitude for the sacrifice they made.

Now their methers, wives and families pay homage. 2,385 names are recorded, the names of those who have no grave but the sea.
