During Exercise Mariner, in the Atlantic, the cruiser Swiftsure, suffered severe damage to its bridge structure when it collided with H.M.S. Diamond. Thity-two of the crew were hurt, but the fire which broke out was quickly brought under control. H.M.S. Diamond, a heavy destroyer of the Daring class, had its bows crumpled when it hit Swiftsure. No. casualties were reported, but the ship was hurriedly escorted back to pert. Full details of the accident are still not known but the heavy seas are believed to have been the cause.

Nine NATO nations co-operated to make it the biggest Atlantic exercise held since the war.
