NEW HOMES FOR QUAKE VICTIMS.

A new idea in pre-fabs makes its debut in London. Window, doors and so on are quickly erected on the metal framework that forms the shell of the house. Easy and cheap to build, they are designed to replace the hundreds off Greece. Speedily the Greek authorities are struggling to clear the devastation and rebuild, but still thousands have nowhere to live.

Soon these people will receive the first of the new all-British houses. The firm which makes the framework is making a gift of 20,000 feet of it (enough to make twenty homes) plus this prototype house. Soon, it is expected, many more will be bought from the funds collected for the earthquake victims. Wearing traditional Greek costume, a little girl looks over the new house. The fully-equipped prototype is being sent to Greece to show labourers how the job is done, and how local materials can be used for the walls and roof. The gift of the new houses is formally received by the Greek Ambassador on behalf of the people of his country.

In a practical manner, Britain extends her sympathy to her friends in Greece.
