DUKE - AIRMEN'S GRAND MASTER.

At the Grocer's Hall in the City of London, the Duke of Edinburgh is installed as Grand Master of the Guild of Air Pilots and Air Navigators of the British Empire. He succeeds the Queen, who, as Princess Elisabeth, held this distinguished office until accession. Each year the Guild awards trophies for outstanding air achievements. The Johnsten Trophy was won by the R.A.F. crew which flew over the North Pole in 1951.

Mr. E.S. Calvert wins the Cumberbatch Reliability Trophy for his work on airfield approach lighting. On behalf of the 1950-51 winners of the Cumberbatch Trophy, Tasman Empire Airways, Sir Miles Thomas receives a memento scroll from the Duke.

A great ovation from the many famous flying personalities present, greets the Duke as he begins his address:
