ENGLAND VERSUS THE REST OF THE WORLD.

England in white shirts meet the Rest of the World Eleven at Wembley, before a crowd of nearly a hundred thousand. England kick-off and move towards their opponent's goal. This truly international match is being held to mark the ninetieth anniversary of the Football Association.

Now Stanley Matthews takes a hand. He'll make sure England will fight to the last anyway. Typical Matthews trickery beats Hannapi. On he goes, but his shot hits the bar.

Zeman, the Rest's goalie, muddles a defensive save, and Mullen just walks it in to chalk up another for England. And if that was a lucky one, well its O.K. by the home supporters.

The ref stops in when Zeman tries to change with substitute goalie Beara owing to injury, but that's not allowed til half-time. When the change-over comes, Cajovaki's mighty passing shot puts the ref out for count. He's certainly earning his keep in this match. It's not a bad injury though enough to hold things up for a moment or two.

Play resumes and Matthews takes command to the crowd's delight. In the penalty area his shot hits Posipal. Mullen aims at the loose ball, and England have equalised.

Posipal, a German, tumbles as England try for another. But Bears's graceful leap deals with the situation. Now the Rest swing play towards the English end. Kubala tries a solo raid, and a sizzling shot beats Merrick all the way. Just to make sure, Boniperti nets it as well.

Mattews gives it all he's got to level the score again. Down the wing and into the centre. He beats Henoppi. Mullen leaps to head, and Bears kicks it out of the net.. Another problem for referee Griffiths. Was it a goal or wasn't it? From a huddle comes the decision, no goal.

England brush up their tactics and give a good display as the clock creeps towards full time. Posipal and Mortensen collide and, despite protests, England are awarded a penalty. There'll be plenty of argument about that incident.- though there's no argument about Ramsey's shot which cracks into the net to level the score. In the last 25 seconds, England and the Rest of the World draw with four goals each.
