Mighty Bill Clark, an All Blacks forward, gets it to Tiny White who crashes his way through for a grand touch-down.

But there's no conversion this time. Not that the All Blacks should worry. Elson soon gets them three times in a matter of minutes. So with the score 17-3 against them, the Welshmen hurl themselves into the attack again and again. Llanelly put up one of the stiffest fights the All Blacks have encountered in this country so far, but they can't alter the score which remains All Blacks 17 Llanelly 3.
