

BIG THREE MEET BERMUDA.

Bermuda, scene of the Big Three Conference, prepares to welcome the President of the United States who flies into Kindley Airfield where a crowd of 3,000 is waiting. President Eisenhower is welcomed by the Governor and then moves on to greet Sir Winston Churchill who, earlier, had flown in with Mr. Eden. The Big Three: Churchill, Eisenhower and French Premier Joseph Laniel pose for pressmen and news cameras. Providing a Guard of Honour are men of the Royal Welch Fusiliers who recently performed this same duty when Her Majesty the Queen arrived from London.

Strict security measures are taken at Bermuda and pressmen are carefully scrutinised before they are allowed into the Mid-Ocean Club where the talks are held. British troops keep close guard over the building where for four days matters affecting world peace are discussed. Now that the meetings have ended it has been announced that Churchill, Eisenhower and Laniel have agreed to an early conference with Russia in Berlin. A communique issued by the Big Three from Bermuda included this statement: "Our meetings have reinforced our solidarity, strengthened our resolve and fortified our hopes. Confident in our common purposes and united in our views, we shall persevere in our policies whose sole aim is to foster and assure peace".
